Chairmans Statement

The good people of Stirling have always dug deep into their pockets to help any project for those in need. Since the first earthquake relief event in 2005, Central Scotland Islamic Centre has given the use of its community hall for essential work to be carried out for any charitable cause.

A huge effort and selfless work comes from the ladies who study at the Islamic Centre, who volunteer, and give their total commitment to every project. With the help of local schools, churches and many businesses, Stirling Aid has developed into a trusted and reputable charity.



Since the start of the Coronavirus pandemic, Trustees were determined to help those in need, especially key workers on the front line. This includes care home staff, delivery drivers, assisting other volunteering organisations too and vulnerable individuals who may not have access to basic essentials and to PPE.

Our purchase network includes a connection to high grade NHS visors. Through these contacts, that includes 300 pharmacists, we were able to purchase from the private network, however many PPE resources have been donated. Stirling Aid was operating Daily from Central Scotland Islamic Centre This is where donations were dropped off for distribution.

Once a week the food is picked up by the Salvation Army and delivered to those in need. To date we have distributed PPE to 13 care homes in the Forth Valley area and beyond including over 1500 visors and 5,000 face masks, gloves and sanitiser and equipment. 1,200kg of food stuff has been delivered for distribution to the Salvation Army.

Finally, Towards the official Hubs coming on line, we started to focus on food, foodbanks and keyworker support-tackling trauma that associated with the pandemic.

Personal Protection Equipment : Mask Initiative and Visor



With the onslaught of the Covid, we have immediately started to gather PPE as there is a national shortage. With a request and approval to use the Stirling Islamic Centre Community Hall it became a centre for PPE over critical 3 three months.



By starting a new initiative to try and get as much PPE as possible for Carers and teams alike. Slogans like "If you know how stitch -let's get cracking and if you don't and know where you can lay your hands on some please donate! We are making enquiries to get them."

There was an incredible response , many people stitching and making their own masks to people , 3D printing their version of Visors. We continued this in Earnest to November until Council PPE Hubs came on line

First PPE donations arrival

We received a kind and generous donation of PPE from one of our dear friends (who wishes to remain anonymous) in Birmingham, who we have done a lot of charity work with together over the years.

We must also give special thanks and mention to friends and family especially two volunteers, Sharaz and Shazad . They both live in Bradford and are the Chairman's cousins. They themselves run pharmacies across the north of England and their call for PPE that went well -that went to receive the PPE from as far as Birmingham,

We have received a van load of face masks, hand sanitisers, inco pads, hazmat suits, coveralls and towels as well as long length marigold gloves and Visors which will be donated to various places of need such as care homes, cancer carers and frontline staff. – All this when there was NONE.
